Christmas Bingo with Lori will take place on <u>Thursday</u>, <u>December 18th</u> at 5:30 PM.



Please remember to sign up for all events in advance. Sign up sheets are on the bulletin board in the community room.


WINTER PARKING IN EFFECT: NOVEMBER 1 TO APRIL 1 ANNUALLY

Mindful Moments: Finding Calm This December

December can be joyful, busy and sometimes overwhelming. This month, consider taking a few *Mindful Moments*-small pauses that help quiet the mind and bring a sense of peace:

- One-Minute Breathing: Inhale slowly for 4 seconds, exhale for 6. Repeat 5-8 times.
- The Warm Cup Pause: Hold a warm drink, feel the heat in your hands, and take one slow sip with full attention.
- Micro-Stretch Break: Roll your shoulders, gently stretch your neck, and loosen your jaw.
- Look Out the Window: Notice one beautiful thing- a tree, a cloud, a bird- and rest your mind there for a moment.
